Eastern Researchers form new Mesothelioma Research Network

Cancer researchers from Papworth, Leicester and Imperial College Hospitals have formed a

new national Mesothelioma Research Network which aims to drive a huge boost to research.

Dr. Robert Rintoul, Lead Clinician for Cancer, Director of the Clinical Trials Unit Collaboration at Papworth Hospital and CRN Eastern Sub-specialty Lead for Lung Cancer, said, "Papworth Hospital is delighted to be a part of the new Mesothelioma Research Network. Papworth already has considerable experience in surgical clinical trials in mesothelioma and hosts MesobanK, the UK's first mesothelioma tissue bank. This MRN will be instrumental in driving further progress for all those whose lives will be affected by mesothelioma." The MRN was set up with a generous £5 million donation from the Victor Dahdaleh Foundation.

Papworth's PVDU in the Spotlight



In a busy year for the PVDU Research Team, we recruited almost 300 patients to seven exciting and varied studies. A particular highlight of our year was recruiting the first three patients **worldwide** to a potentially life-changing clinical trial. In addition to our work on clinical trials, our Clinical Research Fellows are at the forefront of our investigator-led studies. These include a genome-wide association study to uncover whether there is a genetic contribution to chronic thromboembolic pulmonary hypertension (CTEPH); a study to better understand the role of the lungs when substances in the blood pass through; and a project shedding more light on possible biomarkers that could predict the success of pulmonary endarterectomy surgery in CTEPH patients. <u>Click here</u> to read more about our studies.

Papworth wins first prize at anaesthetist annual congress.

A team from Papworth won first prize at the Association of Anaesthetists of Great Britain and

Ireland's (AAGBI) Annual Congress for their original research on Extra Vascular Lung Water. The research, led by Consultant Anaesthetists Dr Andrew Klein and Dr Nicola Jones, was shortlisted from 180 abstracts submitted to the Congress in Liverpool – the largest meeting of Anaesthetists in the UK, with over 1,000 delegates.

Study Updates



ETTAA

Since our last update, ETTAA has recruited 750 patients. Recruitment finishes at the end of June 2018. We are also delighted to be hosting our next ETTAA National Event on 29th January 2018 for all of our ETTAA sites across the country to update them on the progress of the Study so far and how we aim to reach our recruitment targets. RITA MI = Rituximab in patients with acute ST-elevation Myocardial Infarction Study

This is a Papworth sponsored study organised jointly with the University of Cambridge. It is led by Dr. Ziad Mallat, professor of cardiovascular Medicine at the University of Cambridge, Dr. Stephen Hoole, Consultant Cardiologist at Papworth Hospital and the Chief Investigator for the Study. The research fellows for RITA MI are Dr Tian Zhao and Dr Muhammad Aetesam. the Research Nurse is Rincy Kurian. Our first patient was recruited on 26th September 2017. So far 33 patients have been screened and three have been recruited to the trial.

MesoTRAP

This is a pilot clinical trial and feasibility study comparing video-assisted thoracoscopic partial pleurectomy/decortication with indwelling pleural catheter in patients with trapped lung due to malignant pleural mesothelioma designed to address recruitment and randomisation sample requirements Phase Ш uncertainties and size for а trial. The MesoTRAP Trial opened up its 15th site in December - a great achievement and huge thanks to all of the sites for their hard work! Recruitment is well underway and is due to be completed at the end of 2018. Over 150 patients have been screened so far. MesoTRAP has launched its own study newsletter. Ventilate

The primary aim of ventilate is: To determine if a spontaneously ventilating general anaesthetic technique using a Laryngeal Mask Airway (LMA) is superior for patients undergoing lung biopsy for diagnosis of ILD, compared with a traditional general anaesthetic technique using a double lumen endotracheal tube (DLETT) and positive pressure ventilation, as determined by length of stay. We are still in recruitment. We currently have 16 patients and our target is 50.

Magna Ease Trial

The Magna Ease Trial completed its last patient last year 8 visit on 20th December 2017. The close out visit is scheduled for the end of January 2018. Thank you to everyone who has worked on the study in the past 8 years.
