1. Purpose:

2. AHP Day Celebrations – 14 October 2022:

October 14 was AHP Day, the day we celebrate the work of the Allied Health Professions (and honorary professions).

This year we had a focus on raising greater awareness across the Trust of the unique skills of these specialist teams. We ran 'In your Shoes' sessions with Execs, Clinical Directors, Consultants, and other clinical colleagues shadowing AHP clinicians which were really well received by all involved. We also ran a social media takeover with 'A day in the Life' of each of the profession to highlight the niche roles of the AHPs and of course we also ran our AHP awards, based on the Trust values, for which we received 126 nominations. As well as awards for each profession we presented an AHP of this year award. This year AHP of the Year was awarded to Afua Tobigah, Social Work Team lead.

3. International Infection Prevention Week – w/c 17 October 2022

The Trust celebrated 50 years of infection prevention with International Infection Prevention Week from 17 October.

The Infection Prevention and Control Team set up a stall in the Atrium and hosted games, quizzes and information events to celebrate the week. This enjoyable and informative week was valued by all who took part.

4. Fundamental of Care Standards

The CQC has 12 Fundamental Standards against which the Trust has developed an audit review template to ensure that one fundamental standard is reviewed each month, overseen by the Fundamentals of Care Board. The process has been refreshed with additional training for peer review and improved governance. This ensures that the Trust has a deeper understanding of CQC regulations and fundamental standards.
