1 Purpose/Background/Summary

2 Key item(s)

2.1 Karen Caddick to resign from Board of Directors

In the last few weeks, one of our non-executive directors, Karen Caddick, has resigned. Karen has served on Royal Papworth Hospital's Board of Directors since November 2013 and has made an invaluable contribution to the hospital during this time.

3.1 Visit from Institut Jantung Negara in Malaysia
