Recent publications have focused on neonatal potential for donation, professional views / ethical analysis of elective intubation and the current status of paediatric donation in the UK. Angie is also Co-Chair of the Paediatric group within ELPAT the Ethical, Legal and Psychological subgroup of the European Society of Transplantation (ESOT).

Angie commenced her role as Lead Nurse: Paediatric and Neonatal Donation and Transplantation within NHSBT in February 2016 and is leading work in addressing the challenges of donation and transplantation in this field across the UK.
