
## **Quick NICE A-Z Guide**

The best way to find out if we have access to a specific journal is by searching the NICE database.

Please note that you need to have an OpenAthens account. If you don't have one, you can register here <a href="https://openathens.nice.org.uk/">https://openathens.nice.org.uk/</a>

To search the NICE database:


1. Go to <a href="https://journals.nice.org.uk/">https://journals.nice.org.uk/</a> You will see the following screen:



3. Search for the title of the journal.

TIPS: Look for the full title as well as the acronym: e.g. JACC as well as the full title Try removing the article 'The' if the title doesn't come up: e.g. 'The Lancet' or 'Lancet'

4. You will get a result like this:



- 5. Click on the ClinicalKey link (or other link that has come up, e.g. from ProQuest or Wiley) TIP: Always make sure you are logged into OpenAthens once you reach ClinicalKey.
- 6. If the journal isn't listed in NICE, it's because we don't have free access to it. In this case, you can request it by logging into your <u>library account</u> and filling in the form "Request a journal article".
