

## **Royal Papworth Hospital Consent for Associated Data Storage**

You are being offered a Covid-19 vaccine, to be administered by the Trust, in order to protect you, your family and your colleagues.

As you will be aware, this vaccine is being rolled out nationally and the speed with which it has been made available is unprecedented and only possible due to the amazing collaborative efforts of healthcare scientists both in the UK and overseas.

Ideally, records of vaccinations should sit with your GP and with Occupational Health. However, due to the speed of roll out and the national reporting criteria associated with the vaccine, it is necessary for a patient record to be created for you in Lorenzo (Royal Papworth Hospital electronic patient record/patient administration system).

Only staff who are involved in the vaccination programme will have a legitimate right to view your Lorenzo record and the only processing of your data undertaken will be to facilitate your booking and to report to your GP and national bodies who are monitoring and overseeing the vaccination programme.

It is an offence to view any patient record without a legitimate care relationship and all staff will be reminded of their duty of confidentiality.

It is anticipated that your record will need to be kept for at least 10 years. However, it is hoped that once the vaccination programme and all associated reporting is completed, staff records within Lorenzo will be anonymised.

By ticking the appropriate box below, you are consenting to having your data, which will include your name, address, contact information, date of birth and NHS number held within the Trust's electronic patient record (Lorenzo). If you do not consent to this, Royal Papworth Hospital will not be able to supply you with the vaccination and you will have to wait until it is available through an alternative healthcare provider, such as your GP.
