

Poor health literacy

How big is the problem?

43% of adults (18-65) do not have adequate literacy skills to routinely understand health information.

Health literacy is about a person's ability to understand and use information to make decisions about their health.

A patient with low health literacy will generally struggle to:

- read and understand health information
- know how to act on this information
- know which health services to use and when to use them (NHS England, 2019).

The World Health Organisation (2015) define health literacy as "the personal characteristics and social resources needed for individuals and communities to access, understand, appraise and use information and services to make decisions about health".
